



Behaviour Policy Annex - Covid-19 Return to School

In line with government guidance on changes to school behaviour policies, this annex has been written to compliment The Radstone Primary School Behaviour Policy.

Expectations

In addition to the Behaviour policy, pupils are expected to:

- Follow all altered routines for arrival and departure
- Follow school instructions on hygiene, such as handwashing and sanitising
- Follow instructions on who pupils can socialise with at school.
- Move around the school as per the specific instructions e.g. one way systems, queuing, out-of-bounds areas
- Follow expectations about sneezing, coughing, tissues and disposal (in line with the “catch it, bin it, kill it” message) and avoidance of touching mouth, nose and eyes
- Follow rules about sharing any equipment or other items including drinks bottles
- Follow rules on amended expectations about break-times or play-times, including where they can and cannot play
- Follow rules on toileting

Ladder of Consequences

At The Radstone, we understand that it will take a little time for pupils to learn, adapt to and secure the new behaviour expectations. We will therefore assess each non-compliance on an individual basis before judgement is made. Level 1 will offer a polite reminder to all children. However, if non-compliant behaviour is with intent and/or persistent, then the Ladder of Consequences will be followed.

Ladder of Consequences:

Stage	Consequence
1	Initial expectation setting / reminder, individually or as group. Final warning – name written on the board. May result in an opportunity to reflect with the teacher in their own time.
2	Yellow stage: Failure to respond at Stage 1, or for more extreme behaviour resulting in a relevant, planned sanction; time out within a lesson, or time off / miss their next break time/lunchtime and relevant/restorative sanction in this time. Phonecall home warning of possible return to home-schooling if behaviour continues due to risk posed to others.
3	Orange stage: Behaviour persists – proceed immediately to red due to risks posed to others
4	Red stage – Pupil is returned to home-schooling for a period of time. This can only be authorised by the Headteacher.

Insensitive or inappropriate remarks regarding Covid-19 are strictly prohibited and any incidents will be investigated and sanctioned appropriately.

To ensure the safety of all pupils/staff, if any child spits or purposefully coughs towards any other person, they will be immediately escalated to Level 4 of the Ladder of Consequences.
